Thoughts/ Issues Discussed –

- Are guidelines being enforced?
- Absentee landlords many have local managers, but the City tends to want to deal direct with the landlords.
- Preservation/ restoration of brick streets.
- Creation of a Millikin tie to French Academy, similar to the one with Dennis School.
- Reduction of train horn noise levels.
- City addressing empty lots with methods other than adding liens.
- Homesteading obtain empty lots/ homes for free within certain ownership parameters.
- TIF district options.
- Availability of grants to aid in preservation efforts.
- Improve local aesthetics associate with Beautify Decatur initiative?
- Getting realtors more interested in the area.
- CHDO money is available, but the administration requirements are cumbersome.

There seems to be some confusion regarding the difference between the West End and Near West Side

Central Christian Church; Staley and Mueller Museums; Oakwood Business Association; Millikin Homestead; Ogelsby Mansion; African American Museum

Should the area be referred to as the Museum District, or Millikin Heights?
