

Board Meeting Minutes Millikin Heights Board Meeting – May 11, 2021

Notes: Due to social distancing requirements associated with the COVID-19 crisis, the meeting was held remotely via a Zoom conference call.

Call to Order at 7:00 pm.

The February and April 2021 minutes were reviewed and accepted as written.

Financial Report –

Total Current Assets = \$7,830.76; Total Assets = \$35,582.76. Charlotte indicated there were slightly less assets due to LFL book purchases and electric bill payment. There is a question being deliberated regarding treatment of property related assets.

The Treasury report was accepted as-is.

Old Business:

Little Free Library (LFL) -

Charlotte indicated the following updates:

- Eight LFL's are up and two not yet in service.
- She researched Dollar General and their grants are based on quantifying the benefits, which may not relate well to the LFL application.
- She has a couple of prospective items available for repurposing as LFLs.
- The LFL organization is going to have upcoming zoom events including other stewards.

Beautification:

Discussed a future Neighborhood Cleanup Day – looking at possibly Saturday, June 26th in the Lincoln Park Area. Also discussed the possibility of reducing the time frame to two hours.

Neighborhood Revitalization:

- 124 N. Edward Alan has a meeting scheduled with Cordaryl Patrick in Community Development to further discuss the CHDO project.
- Alan plans to take NWRAPS related archive documents to the Library History Room.

June 8, 2021

- At this time the Homestead is planning a lawn party on June 16th. Discussed possibly participating and providing flyers about the next neighborhood clean-up; selling t-shirts and implementing a raffle as a membership benefit.
- Alan discussed the pursuit of creating QR codes for historical homes in the area, including thoughts on a laminated template (which Krista offered to help design); sizing them about 5x7 and applying them with yard stakes.
 A motion was made to "Allow the expenditure of up to \$50 for purchase of yard stakes." The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

New Business:

Jim indicated that the old Mueller house at Pine & North sold recently for \$9,000. Alan was going to draft a letter to the new owner to explain some of the requirements of the Historic District, and determine if they might have an interest in donating it to NWRAPS.
